

Browder's claim of "use of force," backed by fake documents.

The first appears to be an affidavit sworn titled *Affidavit for the application of handcuffs issued by the Russian*



government to be filled out and provide an explanation and justification for incidents in which a prisoner is subjected to the "special means" of being handcuffed. Apart from not mentioning before or using anything about Maginsky being beaten, it explicitly states that he was placed in handcuffs, not

instead out of concern that he would harm himself.

Moreover, this accords exactly with what's said in the Moscow Public Oversight Commission [\(2016\)](#). It tells us that, on the night he died, Maginsky began to act very erratically, the doctor thought his behavior "looked like acute psychosis and delirium of persecution," so "(they called for psychiatric emergency)" and "(they put handcuffs on Maginsky's hands.)"
