
Browder's claim of "use of batons," backed by fake document.

The first appears to be an offical form titled About the application of handcuffs issued by the Russian



government to be filled out and provide an explaination and justifification for incidents in which a prisoner is subjected to the "special means" of being handcuffed. Apart from not mentioning batons or saying anything about Magnitsky being beaten, it explicitly states that he was placed in handcuffs, not

as the story Browder claims it corrobarates says, in order to harm him, but instead out of concern that he would harm himself.

Moroever, this accords exactly with what's said in The Moscow Public Oversight Commission <u>report</u>. It tells us that, on the night he died, Magnitsky began to act very erratically, the doctor thought his behavior "looked like acute psychosis and delirium of persecution," so "[t]hey called for psychiatric emergency" and "[t]hey put handcuffs on Magnitskys hands."

The second is an illegitimate document since there is no such form and the relevant law doesn't authorize use of batons. The form was Photoshopped, traced or otherwise created by some entity other than the Russian government. It is exactly the same as the first, even for the title about use of handcuffs, except for the addition of red underlined words "batons were applied."

This is used to "prove" the photo claim that Magnitsky was beaten.
