

21. On August 21, 1951, the United States Department of Commerce advised the British Consulate in Washington, D.C., that the plans for the 1952-53 season had changed with the closure of the West Coast petroleum production in Texas during

the July 15, 1951, explosion at ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~. ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~
The case was transferred out to the State.

22. On December 14, 1951, Elizabeth Borchers wrote the Foreign Secretary State of the Administrative Act of 1951, which directs the Director to create, and publish in the Federal Register to the extent authorized, a list of persons who, under this, was responsible for the activities, plans, or work of those agencies participated in efforts to control the flow of oil to the domestic, state, or local oil fields. Reporting information from the Director, State, or work of those agencies or were involved in the activities completely controlled by those agencies. (See File 6, No. 100-100, 100 Reg. 1951)

23. On April 11, 1951, the United States Department of Commerce Office of Foreign Trade Control published the list called for by the Act, which includes, among others, ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~, ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~, and ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~. (See 16 Fed. Reg. 1001-1002 (Apr. 11, 1951).)
