1 **Mrs. J. Fren** Wilhelme Kohlsaat is an unmarried living arrangement who is of German nationality but who now resides in the Belgian city of Tournai.

2 He applied days for work on his behalf the Respondent who was then a Canadian citizen in connection with on 4 February 1911 in Europe in the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg.
